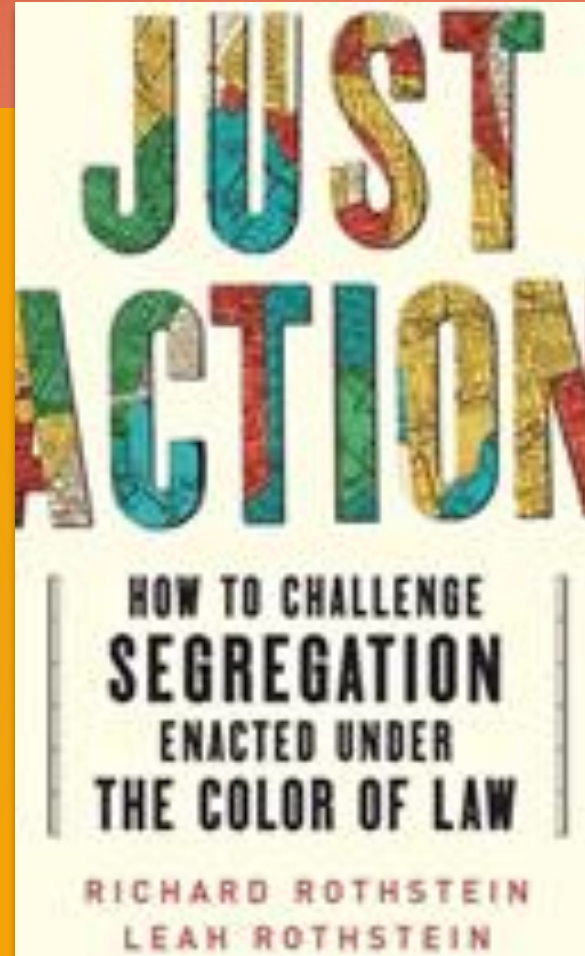

National Low Income Housing Coalition Advancing Housing Justice through Federal Advocacy

2023 has proven to be an eventful year in federal housing policy, marked by both significant progress and challenges. Bipartisan bills that would bolster housing stability for the most vulnerable households were introduced in Congress, federal agencies are taking steps to implement the vision set forth in the Renters Blueprint Tenant Bill of Rights by the Biden Administration, and it is down to the wire for Congress to pass its federal spending bills by the October 1 deadline to avoid a government shutdown.

With lots of movement happening at the federal level, now is the time for every individual to actively participate in advocacy efforts. By staying involved and informed, you can play a vital role in shaping the future of housing policy and its direct impact on your community. In this session, you will gain a deeper understanding of the current housing policy landscape at the federal level; discover how these policies directly influence and affect the lives of individuals and families in your community; and learn how to become an effective advocate to advance housing justice.
